REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to Pamporovo ^{Bulgaria}
and the XXI INTERSKI CONGRESS

It is hard to believe that four years have passed since we held our last Congress in Ushuaia/Argentina in 2015. The Presidium of Interski International has made good use of the interim period and has been working hard at its meetings, discussing and deciding on several essential changes to prepare the ground for the future of Interski.

Ever since its establishment in 1951, promoting snow sports worldwide and supporting its member countries have been key tasks for Interski. I have therefore no doubt that awarding the 2015 Congress to Ushuaia/Argentina was the right thing to do – it was the right decision and an important one too. Even though there was some legitimate criticism regarding organizational matters, we must not disregard the framework conditions our Argentinian friends were up against in staging the Congress. I wish to take this opportunity to thank them once more for all their efforts.

WORKING REPORT

The member survey conducted at the Congress has given the Presidium a clear mandate and a guideline for dealing intensively with the future of our organization. At monthly Skype meetings, we tackled important issues like the amendments to the Statutes, the Congress programme, the drafting of new bidding guidelines for the Congress, not to forget the various concerns of our members. Attending the General Assemblies of ISIA, IVSI and IVSS is always a fixture in the President’s schedule and a perfect opportunity for making making new contacts and resolving open issues.

The amended Statutes were adopted unanimously by the General Assembly in Pamporovo. Various invitations from associations, a major winter sports event in China and the IVSI Congress in Japan were also on the agenda. Whenever discrepancies arose within national Interski associations, we acted as mediator, encouraging dialogue and personal contact. It will however be indispensable to define clear guidelines for the organization and structure of national Interski associations if we are to avoid conflict in the member countries in future. Of course, supporting Bulgaria in preparing and organizing the Congress has been one of the main tasks of the Presidium over the past four years.

FUTURE

In addition to the Presidium members, several Board members of the three pillar organizations were invited to attend our meeting in Frankfurt. This very intensive and constructive meeting marked the first step towards implementing concrete points of our strategy for the future. Alongside many other projects, this will be the most important task by far in the coming years.

I have already mentioned that we need new guidelines for the membership of national associations in Interski, but also of new institutions or individuals representing the interests of many different organizations.

It will also be indispensable to put Interski on a sound financial footing. Unless we manage to achieve this, any further debate on the future of Interski is futile. Every association needs a healthy (financial) background to do a good job. Finally, it is a matter of the heart for me to thank all those who have contributed to making the last four years a success: the Presidents of the three pillar organizations, my two Vice-Presidents and especially my Secretary-General Peter Mall for getting so many things done in his calm and considerate manner.

It’s been a successful four years - let’s keep up the good work.

REPORT OF THE VICE PRESIDENTS
INTERSKI INTERNATIONAL

We were elected 4 years ago in Ushuaia, Argentina. It has been an honor to serve you, the members of Interski, and a great pleasure to work with such a dedicated team as the Interski Presidium. We must also recognize the hard work of our Secretary General, Peter Mall. His hard work is what puts all of our ideas into action. Lastly, the Interski Organizing Committee in Bulgaria, especially Petar Iankov and Ruska Chalykova. It is wonderful to see their efforts come to fruition.

Soon after the last Congress, the Interski Presidium conducted a survey of participants who attended that event. The results of that survey created a valuable tool for the Presidium to plan this Congress and the future of Interski.

WE FOUND THREE MAIN AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT FOR THE CONGRESS:

- Provide timely information and communication with our members.
- Improve organization of the program for all sports.
- Include more time for sharing of education and social interaction between participants.

The Interski Presidium used the survey results to begin planning for this Congress, but we also wanted to hear directly from the nations. To that end, we held a “World Café” during the General Assembly in 2017. This gave each nation an opportunity to openly discuss their ideas about the Congress and help design the schedule to better meet their needs.

It is not easy to create an event for such a diverse group of educators. However, we hope that you feel you have received the information you need in advance. As you can see from the schedule, we tried to maximize the time for on-snow workshops and indoor lectures. We also tried to create social time, as this is when people connect with each other.

During the past 4 years, the Interski Presidium has also been busy planning for the future in five main ways:

- More effective and efficient operations by increased use of email and video conferences, as well as encouraging the three pillar associations to coordinate meeting schedules. We hope this will eventually reduce travel costs for member countries as well.
- Developing a closer working group through monthly video conferencing. This allows us to address issues openly and in a timely way.
- Revising the Bid Book, so interested nations and resorts could more easily understand what it takes to host an Interski Congress. This added clarity should hopefully reduce confusion and help host nations to hold more successful events by understanding what is expected in advance.
- The Interski Statutes have been updated to reduce confusion and help nations better understand the organization they support.
- The Presidium has begun to look towards the future of Interski International, to seek out the path that will create a more valuable organization and grow snowsports around the world. After all, this is your organization. You participate because you want to improve at inspiring more skiers and riders.

There is still room to grow and improve the organization and this Congress. It is a long journey, but we strive to keep heading in the right direction. Please take a moment to share your thoughts with us and fill out the survey after this event. Your voice matters and we need to hear as many as possible.

We wish you an enjoyable XXI Interski Congress. May your days be fun and filled with amazing turns, inspiring presentations, the renewal of old friendships and the creation of new ones.

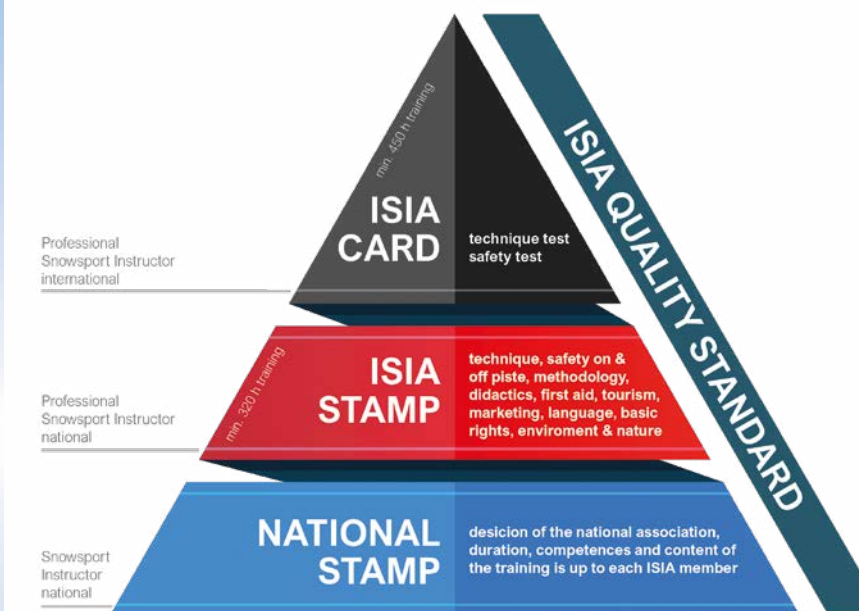

REPORT OF THE IFSI PRESIDENT

PRELIMINARY REMARKS:

My report relates to the period starting with the last ordinary Delegates' Assembly held at Hakuba/Happo Conference Centre, Japan on 24 March 2017 at 17.00h. In my report in Hakuba, I pointed out the diverse challenges facing snow sports in general and IFSI in particular. In the past two years, IFSI has focused mainly on organisational changes which I will address in more detail later in my presentation.

The rapid changes in the framework conditions for our sport I addressed in Hakuba, have since become reality. Climate change is restricting winter sports opportunities, as we have seen so drastically this last winter. Shorter seasons as well as higher demands on slope conditions and accommodation standards are putting more pressure on prices while making winter sports an ever more expensive pleasure, especially for families.

What we therefore need as ski instructors is more community spirit and less competitive thinking.

We are the opinion leaders, we are the trendsetters; this comes with a responsibility that we must live up to also as members of Interski. Our sport is in worldwide competition with countless other leisure activities. That is why in our work as instructors, it is imperative that we focus on communicating the great fascination of snowsports.

In this regard, IFSI instructors have a certain head start over others because they work with established communities or groups most of the time and can therefore benefit from existing ties and social structures.

WHAT'S NEW SINCE HAKUBA?

The Presidium that was elected at the last Delegates' Assembly (see organisational chart) and the newly established committees started implementing the resolutions directly after the Congress (Committee meetings in Frankfurt on 20/21 Apr 2017 and Executive Board meeting in Frankfurt on 23/24 Jun 2017). Following up on a question about the legitimacy of the Delegates' Assembly raised by the Austrian head of delegation Werner Wörndle, it was ascertained that the DA had been convened in conformity with the Statutes.

The members and spokespersons of the new committees were appointed, with Kati Egri in charge of coordination:

- Strategy and Organization with Kati Egri, Jerzy Kaliski, Fritz Mares
- Technical Committee with Chris Exal, Joris van Gestel, Pawel Krnac, Norbert Schied, Jean Marc Villemin, Krysztof Zieba, Stefan Schiel
- Research and Development/Cooperation with Schools and Universities with Dieter Bubeck, Takazumi Fukuoka, Katarzyna Gorska, Rudolf Leber, Jean Marc Villemin

From 19th to 22nd Oct 2017, contract negotiations for the IFSI Congress in 2021 took place with ARASIA in Sochi, Russia. Jerzy Kaliski, Rudolf Leber and Fritz Mares were on site to conduct the negotiations on behalf of IFSI.

The IFSI logo has been given a new and more modern look and the website www.ivsi.info has been brought up to date by Penguin Power Communication.

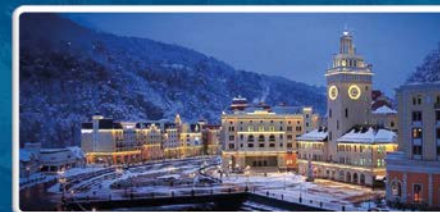

A comprehensive agenda was drawn up for the period up until 2021 at an extended committee meeting in Vienna/Austria on 2nd Sep 2017.

Sergej Khvorostyanyy joined the IFSI Executive Board as permanent representative of Russia up until the Congress in Sochi.

Following Jerzy Kaliski's visit to Nick Herrin in Colorado in February 2017, the USA (PSIA-AASI) was accepted as a member of IFSI at the Executive Board meeting held in Frankfurt on 27 May 2017. At the same meeting, the Board resolved to set up an expert committee for legal issues.

Jens Bühler has replaced Norbert Schied as the German member of the Technical Committee.

At its meeting in Vienna on 1st Sep 2018, the Board decided to re-admit AISS Czech Republic to IFSI. Preparations for the 2021 Congress in Sochi and for the Interski Congress in Pamporovo/Bulgaria were discussed in great detail at the same meeting.

A motion to be included in the agenda of the Interski General Assembly has been drafted and the amended IFSI Statutes have been prepared for approval.

Following a decision taken in Neusiedl an der Zaya/Austria in April 2017, the IFSI Office will be divided into two sites, with the IFSI Office Frankfurt/Germany (Jerzy Kaliski/Ms Giefer) responsible for administration, organisation and reservations, and the IFSI Office Vienna (Prof. Leber) in charge of finances and events.

A skype meeting scheduled for December 2018 unfortunately had to be cancelled owing to technical problems.

In summary, my impression as President is that the various bodies of IFSI have been cooperating in a very constructive, committed and amicable manner. That is not to say that objectives are always achieved quite as quickly as expected. But it isn't any lack of effort on the part of the Board and Committee members that is to blame, but rather the often unclear and complicated structures in the member associations. For this reason, the members of IFSI – and I am happy to say that their numbers are growing – expect further clarification and adaptation processes to be made to the structures of Interski. We should all be ready and willing to unify and strengthen the „old“ world of snow sports, and to integrate new and aspiring nations into tried and tested structures.

IFSI is looking forward to an exciting and inspiring Interski Congress 2019 in Pamporovo/ Bulgaria.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION SNOWSPORTS AT SCHOOLS AND UNIVERSITIES



IVSS REPORT

During the last two years, we have had several new countries applying for membership within the IVSS family and that is a very positive sign for future work.

The work within the IVSS board has been very constructive. Members of the board are dedicated to the cause of IVSS and we are now talking and trying to structure a strategy for the future. When talking about strategy, we are looking for an even more academic approach. This because if we are going to help each other and move in a positive direction, we need to back up our field with support from research.

A great example of scientific work in a package of a conference was the "2nd SPE Balkan SKI conference" in Jahorina Ski resort, Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, March 11th-15th, 2018. At the conference Prof. Vihren Batchev and Prof. Pete Allison, members of the IVSS board, held two separate presentations. The presentations including a Key note lecture did include scientific work, collaboration between IVSS, Penn state, BASI and PSIA. They also pointed out the work of IVSS within member countries and in particular Bulgaria. This conference is a great example of how IVSS can be involved in the development of scientific work, as well as positive networking.

For you that attended the last IVSS General Assembly in Pamporovo (June 2017), you might remember that we showed a Power Point with a Snowflake. The Snowflake represents the view of the IVSS board in terms of changing Interski to become a more modern and cost effective organization. As we (IVSS) see it, the skiing community can use the resources more effectively, work closer together, develop international projects and eventually have a joint office. The "snowflake" is shown on the left.

During the winter/spring 2018, in the northern hemisphere, the IVSS board admitted the Chinese Association of Snow Sport Instructors (CASSI) of China as a full member of IVSS. We look forward to have them in our organization.

The IVSS homepage will not be changed until after the IVSS GA in Pamporovo. This will be something for the new board and we know that there are a lot of ideas in terms of social networking.

The IVSS board members have been in constant contact with each other and we have also had 4-5 Skype meetings per year since the IVSS GA, 2017.

On May 29th, the IVSS board held a board meeting in Sofia/Bulgaria. The meeting was prepared and organized by Prof. Vihren Batchev and the organization and hospitality from our Bulgarian friends was just great. The IVSS president has also attended the Interski presidium meetings over Skype and also participated in the physical meetings arranged, the last one in Frankfurt, October 15th-17th. In Frankfurt, IVSS vice President Dr. Dieter Bubeck also attended.

The IVSS board has got many signals in terms of the importance of snowsports for the younger generation. Positive signals that shows engagement and commitment for success in the future.

At the congress in Pamporovo we will see countries coming together under the Interski ski school umbrella. We will also see have the opportunity to experience the „Riglet park“-project on site as a way for young kids to start snowboarding.
